

MY CHILD HAS SPECIAL NEEDS, WHAT HELP WILL THEY BE GIVEN?

Depending upon the specific needs required depends upon the support given. A child with severe needs would require an EHCP to ensure 1:1 support is provided. Each classroom has a qualified teacher, teaching assistant and 30 pupils. Any pupil with an EHCP will receive the support / guidance recorded but this individual support varies according to the needs of the plan.

Some parents delay starting their child at school until they turn 5 years of age. They chose to keep their child in their Pre-School setting where there are fewer children and smaller staff to pupil ratio's.

Learning issues: Some pupils learn at a slower pace than others. Our pupils will be given additional resources to help them maintain the pace of the cohort where possible. Additional work will be uploaded to our secure platform for parents to work through with their child at home. Working together ensures that any learning skills or knowledge become securely embedded which enables the child to build upon these skills and move their understanding forward. MMR VACCINATION CLINICS

Pop-up MMR vaccination clinics have been organised in Staffordshire in response to rising cases of measles.



Measles is an infection that spreads very easily,

especially in nurseries and schools if children are not vaccinated. It can be a very unpleasant illness. In some children measles can be very serious, leading to hospitalisation and in rare cases can tragically cause death.

Staffordshire County Council are urging everyone who has not yet had their MMR vaccines to attend one of the clinics listed below:

- Saturday 13 April: Burton Fire Station, DE14 3SU10am 2pm
- Thursday 18 April: Burton Fire Station, DE14 3SU3pm 6pm

The MMR vaccine is an injection into the upper arm and non-porcine-containing vaccines are available on request for cultural or religious reasons. The vaccine is free on the NHS.





