
Desert Wildlife



Desert Predators

Some desert animals are predators. They hunt other animals in the desert. Hawks and eagles might eat rabbits, snakes, mice and other birds. Large mammals like coyotes hunt rabbits and mice at night. During the day, coyotes live in burrows in the ground.





Jackals are fast and fierce hunters. They can catch creatures like meerkats. They also scavenge dead animals, eating flesh that would otherwise rot.


Bobcat


Some bobcats live in desert habitats. They use their senses of sight, smell and hearing to hunt their prey which can range from deer and snakes to insects.
